



COMMANDING OFFICER'S SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION AND RESPONSE (SARP) POLICY STATEMENT RESPONSE (SAPR)



Command Commitment & Core Values

Sexual assault is a criminal act that directly contradicts our core values as military medical professionals. It erodes trust, degrades operational readiness, and destroys team integrity. This command maintains a zero-tolerance policy for sexual assault and any form of retaliatory behavior against those who report it.

Every Marine, Sailor, and civilian within this command is entitled to a safe environment characterized by mutual respect, dignity, and professional integrity. Taking care of our people means actively preventing sexual assault and fostering a culture where bystanders confidently intervene. The Marine Corps Sexual Assault Policy is governed in detail by Marine Corps Order 1752.5C (SAPR Program).

Reporting Options Breakdown

If a member of this command becomes a victim of sexual assault, our immediate priority is ensuring their safety, medical care, and emotional support. Victims have two distinct pathways to report an incident:

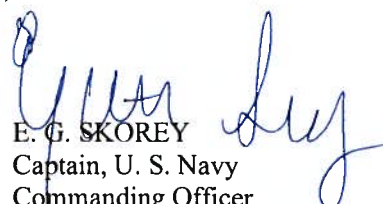
Reporting Option	Confidentiality Level	Key Features & Access
Restricted Reporting	Highly Confidential	Allows victims to confidentially disclose the assault to specified individuals (SARC, SAPR VA, or healthcare personnel) and receive medical treatment, forensic exams (SAFE kit), and counseling without triggering an official investigation or command notification. Victims are now eligible to file a restricted report even if they disclose to the chain of command, given they have not personally disclosed to law enforcement.
Unrestricted Reporting	Need-to-Know Privacy	Triggers an official investigation by law enforcement (NCIS) and command notification. Victims receive full medical care, counseling, and legal support (Special Victims' Counsel). The command will protect the victim's privacy to the maximum extent possible.

****Critical Note on Restricted Reporting:** Confidentiality is legally protected. Information will *not* be shared with law enforcement or command leadership unless the victim explicitly consents, or an established Department of Defense (DoD) exception is met (e.g., an imminent threat to life or safety)
